Greenville Man Gets 12.5 Years In Federal Prison For Drug Dealing

Chief United States District Judge James C. Dever III sentenced Chicobe Antrell Williams, 33, of Greenville, North Carolina to 12.5 years imprisonment, followed by 3 years of supervised release. On January 8, 2018, Williams pled guilty to one count of distribution of a quantity of cocaine base (crack). According to the investigation, in October 2015, investigators with the Greenville Police Department and agents with the Federal Bureau of Investigation began investigating the narcotics distribution activity of Williams. A confidential informant was utilized to make four controlled purchases of cocaine base (crack) from WILLIAMS. WILLIAMS utilized others to assist in 2 his narcotics distribution. In addition to the controlled purchases, Williams was arrested with crack in his possession.

Investigation of this case was conducted by the Federal Bureau of Investigation and the Greenville Police Department. Assistant United States Attorney Dena King represented the government.
